Review: last year's aims and outcomes

Aim	Outcome
Progress in Reading and Writing	Attainment across school remains below national expectations in reading and writing. Writing attainment declined significantly during the period of the pandemic.
Progress in Mathematics	Mathematics attainment has declined during the period of the pandemic and remains below national expectations.
Phonics	Provisional phonics attainment is 65.8%, which is below national expectations.
Other	We have seen a rise in absences for our disadvantaged children in this last year due to COVID 19. Our target is to improve the attendance of our disadvantaged children to match that nationally.
