This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

At St Matthew's Primary School, we follow a spiral curriculum aligned with the National Curriculum and the Model Music Curriculum. Our curriculum is carefully curated using and adapting the Sing Up Music scheme.

Music is taught weekly in lessons lasting a minimum of 40 minutes, delivered by class

teachers or specialist Music teachers. Weekly singing assemblies are held for each

Key Stage, and regular singing takes place in class. Our 'Whole School Songs

Overview' reflects our school culture and values. Music lessons are inclusive, ensuring

all learners, including those with Special Educational Needs (SEND), have access to an adapted and accessible curriculum.

In Music lessons, children explore a wide range of both tuned and untuned

instruments, including glockenspiels and drums. Year 5 and 6 pupils participate in

whole-class Ukulele sessions, taught by specialist Music teachers from Stockport Music Service.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At St Matthew's, we take pride in our school choir. The choir runs year-round and participate in several performances both within the school and in the community. Our choir performs in annual community events, including visits to York Street, Bamford Grange Care Home.

The school has participated in the Halle's 'Come and Play concerts in conjunction with the Music Service and other local schools and was involved in a multi-arts event with

the Halle and Northern Ballet School, which culminated in a performance at Halle St Peters.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Children at St Matthew's take part in weekly celebration assemblies in which they

practise and perform the whole school focus song for the term. Music is also

incorporated into class assemblies, Harvest, Christmas and Easter celebrations.

Our Year 5 and Year 6 ukulele musicians perform concerts for the whole school and parents, incorporating music performance into their end of year production.

We hold a range of Christmas events which are a mix of children's own performances

and enrichment opportunities such as a pantomime visit each year.

Our Nativity performances from our Nursery and Reception children incorporate singing and dancing and are a highlight of the festive period.

In the future

In future years, our Music Development Plan aims to enhance our existing provision by achieving the following:

• Diversifying our music offering with the introduction of an African drumming

ensemble and expanding the range of instruments available in lessons.

• Participating in 'Come and Play' at the Bridgewater Hall with the Hallé Choir for our Year 3 children.

• Develop individual and group tuition opportunities across the school.

• Further developing performance opportunities for our young musicians across the school.

• Continuing to improve our music environments by investing in new instruments and equipment.
